**Can I sign up for a library card?**

**Can I have your photo ID and address, please?**

When you sign up for a library card, you'll usually have to show some form of identification. This can be something like your driver's license or passport. Every library is different, so make sure to find out what your library requires.

When you check a book out from a library, it's expected that you return it by its due date. If you don't do this, then you'll be charged an overdue fine. The fine gets bigger the longer you wait to return your book. You'll have to pay this fine before you can check out any other books. So make sure to return your books on time!
