You can tell someone when your birthday is by following the sentence pattern **My birthday is on + DATE**. There are lots of different ways someone could respond to this. For example, they might ask something like, **Are you planning to do anything for it this year?**.

I'm 32 years old

You can tell someone how old you are by using the sentence pattern **I'm + AGE + years old**. In response, the person might ask something like, **When is your birthday?**.

What are some common birthday traditions in the English-speaking world?

In English-speaking countries there are a couple of common birthday traditions. You usually receive a birthday cake from either friends or family that you share with them. The song Happy Birthday is usually sung as the cake is brought out. The cake is decorated with candles that you have to blow out. Traditionally, the number of candles equals how old you've become on your birthday. So for example, if you turn twenty then your cake would be decorated with twenty candles. Some families follow this tradition, while others simply decorate the cake with a random number of candles. It's important to make a wish before blowing out the candles! If you can blow all the candles out in one go then your wish will come true. Besides the birthday cake, birthday candles, and singing of Happy Birthday it's also very traditional for friends and family to give you gifts on your birthday.
